

AGREEMENT Between the TRUMBULL COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SERVICE CENTER and MCDONALD LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Section 3313.845 of the Ohio Revised code provides that the Board of Education of a local, city or exempted village school district may enter into an agreement for services with a Governing Board of an Educational Service Center; and

WHEREAS, through adoption of identical resolutions, under which the Educational Service Center will provide certain services specified in the agreement;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the TRUMBULL COUNTY EDUCATIONAL SERVICE CENTER ("TCESC") agrees to provide special education programs, supervisory and related services and personnel to the MCDONALD LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT ("District").

- Section 1. The TCESC will assign personnel to implement services as identified in Addendum 1 according to the needs of the District.
- Section 2. The District agrees to reimburse the TCESC through its State Foundation payment according to an annual contract. All costs (personnel, related services, materials, supplies, classroom space charges, equipment and fiscal fee) will be shared among all other Districts with students enrolled in each program except personnel employed specifically for a District student per the student's IEP.

Other individuals hired at district request will be included in the annual contract amount based on the individual's total cost plus fiscal fee.

The shared services will be actual costs of such service(s) above. Shared Services costs for the current school will be estimated based upon the Shared Services costs for the previous school year. The final invoice, submitted prior to August 31st of each school year, will reconcile any differences estimated and actual shared services costs. Payment of the Shared Services invoice is required within sixty (60) days of receipt of invoice.

The costs not covered by liability insurance of TCESC or any District for lawsuits, legal fees, legal settlements, etc., are the responsibility of the participating Districts. Knowledge of any impending lawsuits must be given in writing to the attention of the TCESC Superintendent.

Section 3. Districts who are opting out of a program listed in Addendum 1 must notify the TCESC in writing prior to April 1st of the school year preceding the withdrawal.

Section 4. For each District that provides classroom space and administrative support for these special education programs will be reimbursed as follows:

- 1. The costs of the administration which includes all administrative costs shall be \$5,500.00 for each program in the District.
- 2. The charge for classroom utilization expense including maintenance, custodial, operation costs, and utilities shall be \$5,500.00 per year for a classroom essentially equivalent to the OSFC standard and common areas within the building. All charges for any District renovation must have prior approval of the TCESC Superintendent.
- 3. The charge for ancillary costs such as copying, laminating, cleaning, guidance, nursing, specialists, minor repairs and any other services shall be \$4,500.00;
- 4. Expenditures for remodeling, renovation, equipment and other items which would cost \$1,000.00 or greater require prior notification to and written approval by the TCESC Superintendent.
- 5. Expenditures for an individual student in excess of \$500.00 require prior approval by the District of residence. All such specific student expenditures will be billed to such student's District of residence; and
- 6. There are no administrative or maintenance charges for Pre-school programs; however, ancillary costs identified in Section 3, shall be \$2,000.00.

Section 5. Districts currently providing space but considering not housing a Special Education Program must notify the TCESC Superintendent in writing by December 31st of the year preceding the withdrawal.

Section 6.

- 1. The TCESC will comply with the requirements of 45 CFR 164.504 (e)(1) for safeguarding and limiting access to information concerning Medicaid beneficiaries.
- 2. The TCEC will allow the representative of the U.S. Department of Human Services, ODM, ODE, or their respective designee access to the TCESC books, documents, and records.
- 3. The TCESC acknowledges that neither the organization nor its principles are suspended or debarred.

Section 7. The effective date of implementation of the Agreement shall be August 1, 2018.

Section 8. This Agreement shall automatically renew unless either party gives written notice to the other by April 1st of the school year preceding withdrawal. The TCESC will annually review this agreement and may modify the compensation listed in Section 4.
